November 1-30.



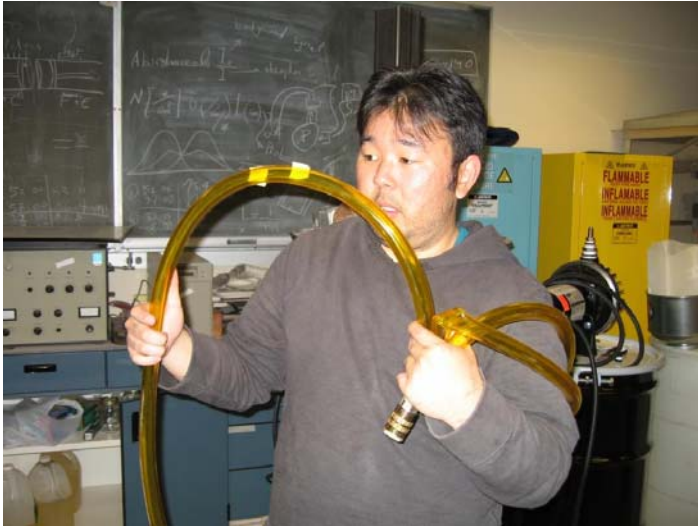

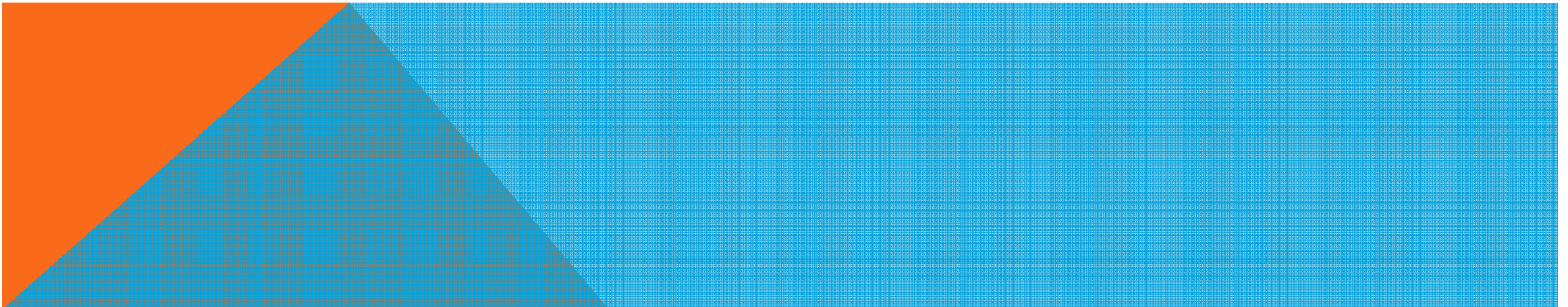

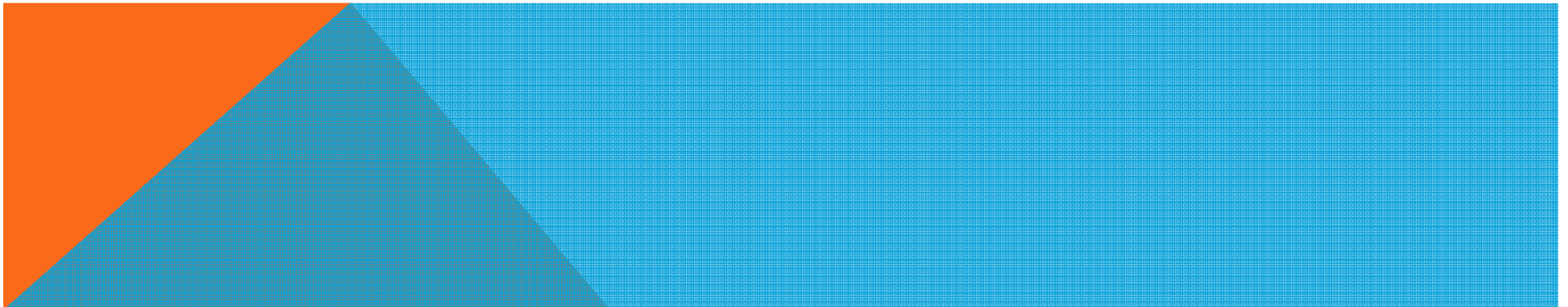

ACT Assessment with Writing or SAT Reasoning Test

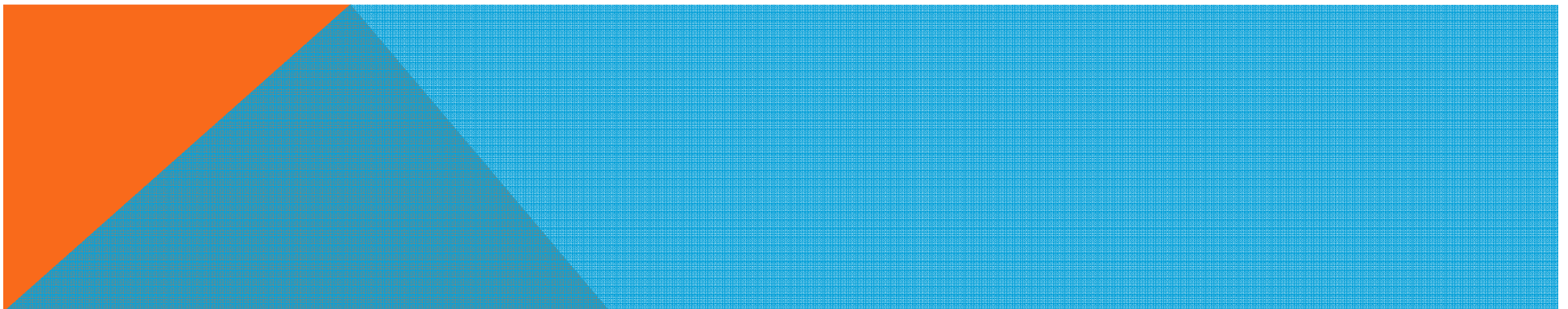

Must be taken by December of the senior year

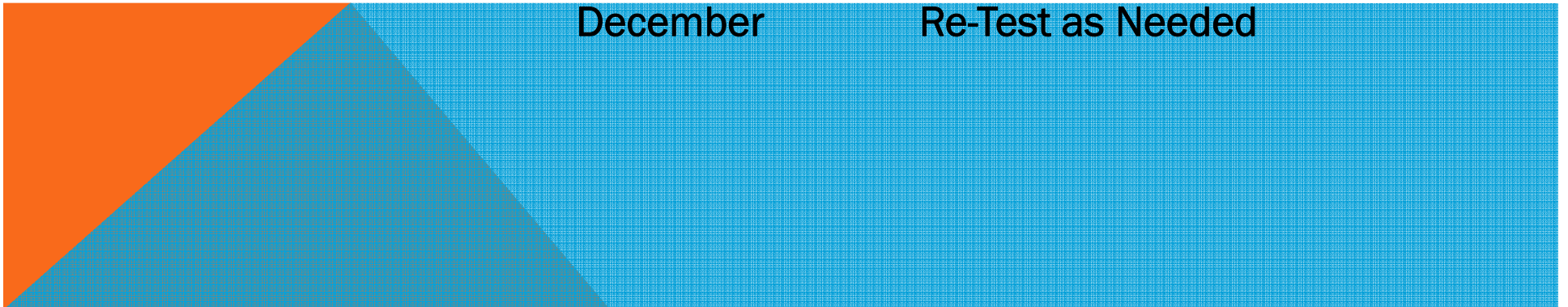
Official scores need only be sent to one UC campus

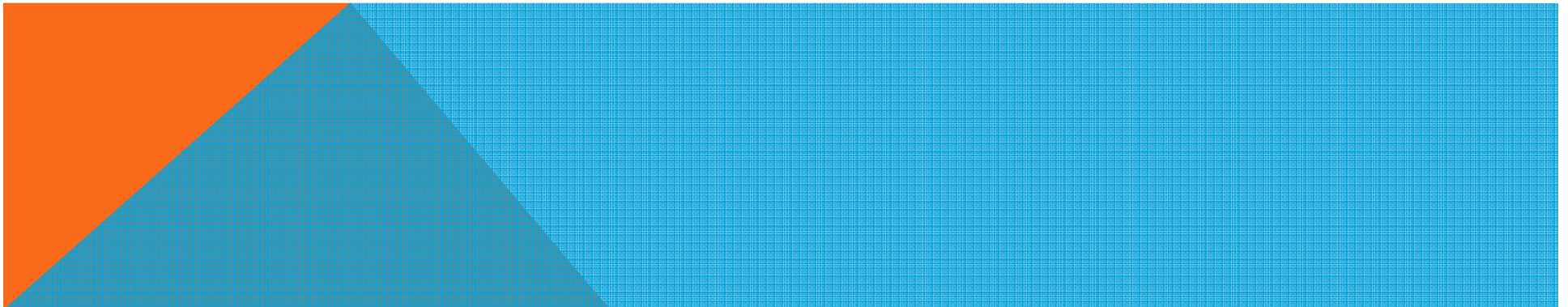

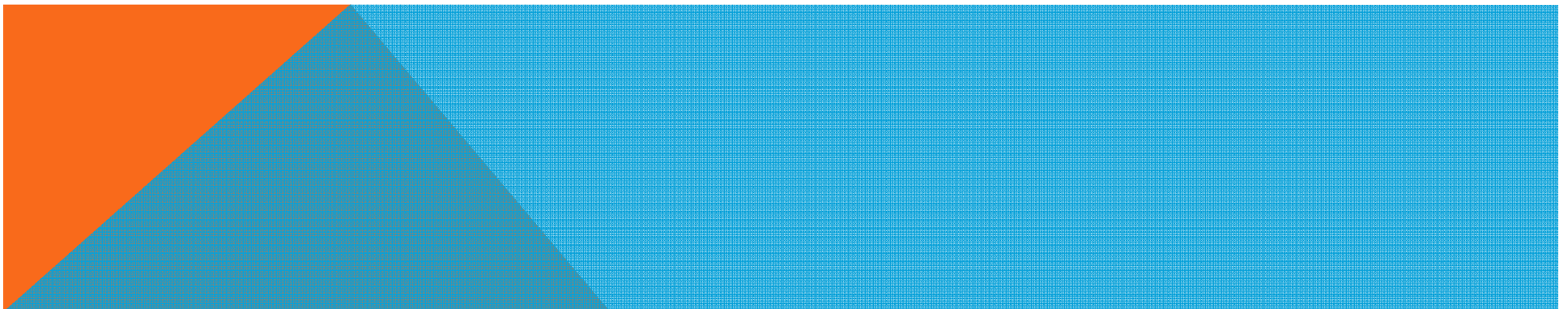


ACADEMIC CRITERIA

Scores on the ACT Assessment plus Writing or the SAT Reasoning Scores on the AP examinations



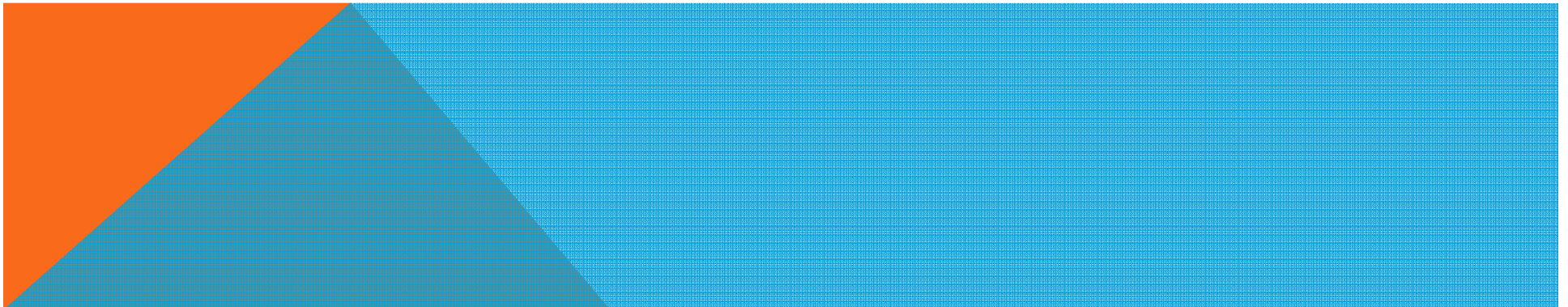
ACADEMIC CRITERIA

Other evidence of intellectual achievement

Extraordinary, sustained achievement in any field or intellectual endeavor

Achievement in academic preparation/enrichment programs

Measured by time and depth of participation, by the academic progress made by the individual during that participation and by the intellectual rigor of the particular program



ADDITIONAL CRITERIA

Personal Characteristics & Achievements

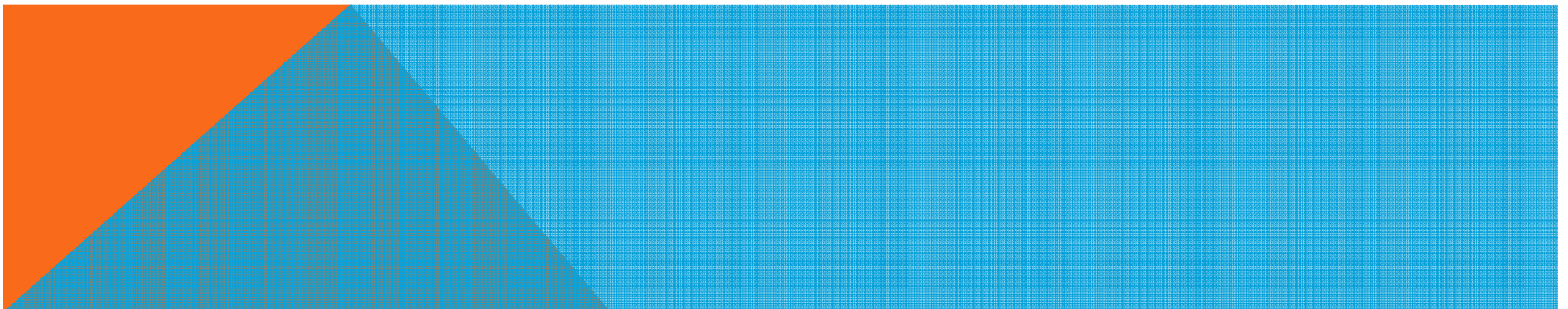
Leadership ability, character, motivation, tenacity, initiative, demonstrated concern for others and the community

Non-academic achievements

Accomplishments in the performing arts or athletics, employment, leadership in school or community organizations or activities, community service

Likely contributions to the intellectual and cultural vitality of the campus

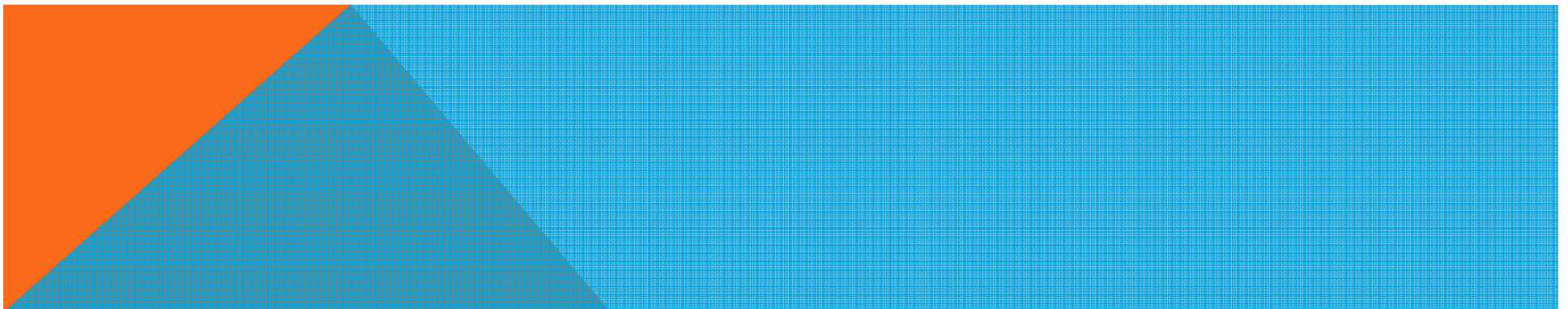

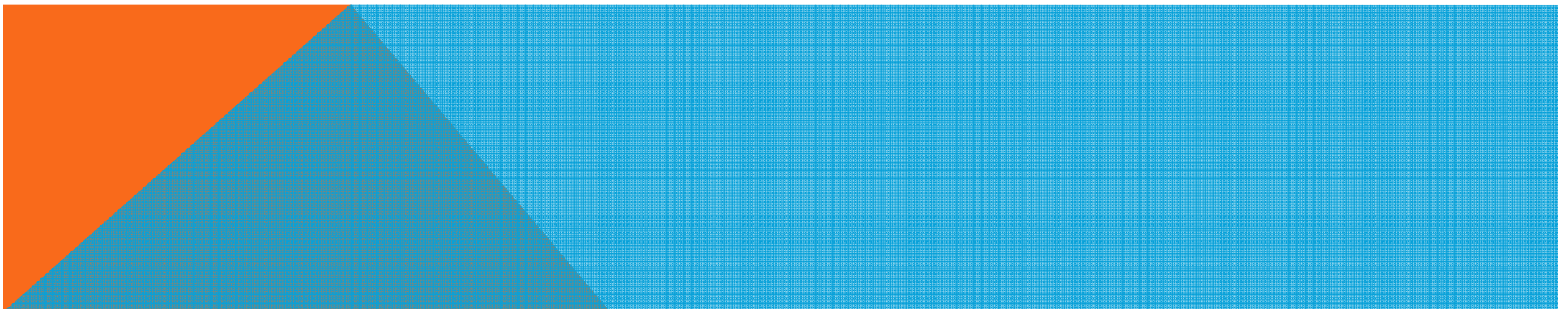

Applicants with the strongest combination of academic and personal achievement will be offered admission based upon available space



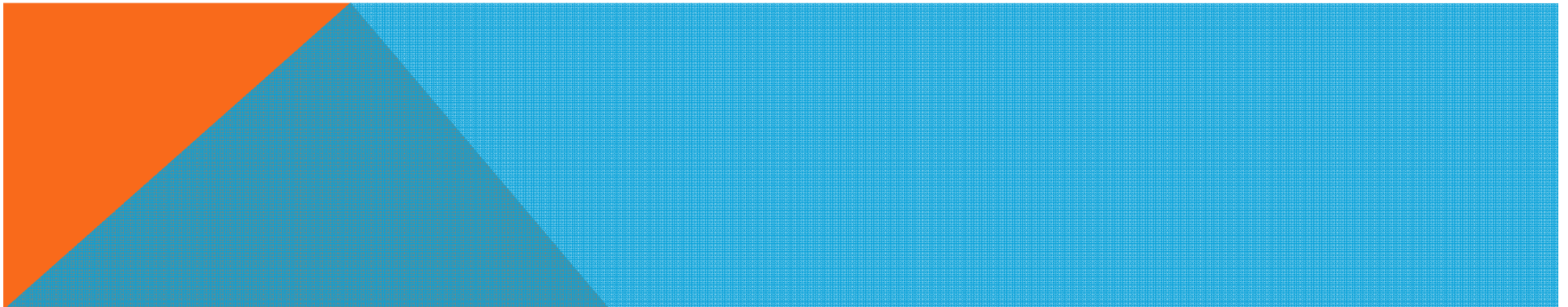
